

Minutes for Selectmen Meeting

Tuesday, February 11, 2014 @ 6:00 PM Southwest Harbor Town Office

- I. Regular meeting was called to order by Ralph Dunbar, Chairman at 6:00 PM. All board members were present including Town Manager Don Lagrange.
- II. There were no visitors not on the agenda to be heard
- III. Thomas Benson moved to accept the minutes of January 28, 2014 as written. It was seconded by David Mincton and voted in favor, 5/0/0. George Jellison moved to accept the minutes of February 4, 2014 as written. It was seconded by Dan Norwood and voted in favor, 5/0/0.
- IV. The Town Manager reported the following:
 - Two bids received for winter sand; Goodwin at 8.91 per yard and Gott at 8.90 per yard. 900 yards required will total \$8,012.
 - ~ The second sludge pump at the sewer plant was rebuilt at a cost of \$17,000 which should provide a life of 5-7 years. The first pump was rebuilt within the last 18 months.
 - Building supplies ordered to construct a wall in the town office for more efficient storage.
 - The fire department will be spending \$780 to replace lighting fixtures which will reduce electrical expense by approximately \$370 per year.
 - ~ Picnic tables are being constructed for the public use in the upper town parking lot. Dunbar suggested a sign 'Gooks Pond Picnic Area''
 - Summary of water revenue for past three years have progressed each year, although the revenue in 2011 was less than 2010.
 - ~ The ballot was changed to include an explanation which was the same as approved on the warrant.
 - The Girl Scouts requested authority to set up a table at the fire station on March 10. No objections from the Selectmen.
 - A discrepancy on Towns P & C insurance included \$100,000 for contents at the Harbor House. The Town does not have any contents at the Harbor House.

VI. New Business:

- a. Tremont Police Proposal: Dave Chapais indicated some fine tuning required and it would probably eliminate a position in the Sheriff's Department. Patrol Officers are willing to do this. Selectmen consensus to send proposal to Tremont.
- b. Assessors (Manager Recommendation): Two proposals received for assessing. Manager Lagrange recommended to keep current assessor due to the

alternate proposal was made from a single person assessor responsible for 8 other towns.

- c. Health Officer: Lagrange suggested to solicit for a health officer and provide a stipend of around \$250 and include mileage as well as a per diem price.
- d. Assessing Quarterly Review: A report from RJD appraisals indicate a net gain in valuation of \$53,000.
- e. Tax Quit Claim Deed: George Jellison moved to sign a quit claim deed for Map 5, Lot 15 and was seconded by Dan Norwood. Voted 5/0/0 in favor.
- f. Willey Building (for sale): The availability of this building was presented to the Selectmen for potential town interest. Consensus there was no need for another public building.
- g. Warrant Committee Appointments
- 1. William Ratcliff, Re-appointment: Dan Norwood moved to accept the re-appointment application from William Ratcliff for the warrant committed. Second by David Mincton. Voted in favor, 5/0/0
- 2. Kim Tate, New appointment: Kim was in attendance and Dan Norwood moved to appoint to the Warrant Committee. Second by David Mincton, voted in favor 5/0/0.
