### Notes:

- A. Mooring Registration fee applies to boats, lobster cars, floats, and Corps of Engineers approved moorings. Each Mooring Registration fee includes one dinghy float permit. Commercial Business Mooring owned by a resident.
- B. For non-mooring owners.
- C. Includes unlimited commercial use of both boat ramps and transfer of equipment and or tackle from the pier, except for commercial fisherman and lobster-buying trucks.
- D. Includes 50 commercial uses or less per year of both boat ramps and transfer of equipment and or tackle from the pier, except for commercial fisherman and lobster-buying trucks.
- E. A “touch” is defined as a period of no more than fifteen minutes during which the barge touches the launching ramp or utilizes the Kayak Launch Area. This fee includes commercial use of boat ramps, parking lots and transfer of equipment and/or tackle from the pier. It does not include overnight parking or storage in a parking lot without Harbor Master permission. Fees are due to the Town office by the 10<sup>th</sup> of each month for previous month usage.
- F. Available only to students fishing 50 State Lobster Tags or less.
- G. Includes use of any Town facilities. All commercial fishermen and other “privately-run water commerce” using town docks must pay regardless of hoist use.

\* “Resident” is defined by our Coastal Waters and Harbor Ordinance as “Any person who occupies a dwelling within the Town of Southwest Harbor for more than 183 days per calendar year.”
